CAN YOU MANAGE AN ALLOTMENT PLOT?

Having an allotment is a fantastic way of growing your own vegetables, getting out in nature and improving mental and physical health, the rewards are great but you should be aware that tending a plot of land does take time and effort. As you are thinking of taking on a plot you should satisfy yourself that you can devote the time and effort necessary, and these notes are intended to give you an idea of the commitment involved.

How much time does it take to cultivate a plot?

The time you need to spend on your plot depends on the size of your plot, the season, what you are growing and your own level of gardening experience.

As a rough guide, you should expect to spend at least 6 to 8 hours a week tending a plot during the main growing season – and perhaps even more during busy periods when planting and picking. Tasks are too numerous to list, but a few of them are listed below:

- Seed sowing and planting
- Weeding – weeds grow most of the year round and can need continual clearing
- Mowing grass paths around your plot and keeping the edges tidy
- Composting or removing from site any weeds and rubbish
- Harvesting produce
- Hedge trimming – where your plot has a hedge boundary

Even outside the main growing season there is always something to do. Prospective plot holders do sometimes underestimate the commitment involved in maintaining a tidy and productive plot.

Plots are subject to regular inspections and must be kept in a good state of cultivation at all times. New plot holders are subject to a 6-month probationary period. During this period they must show that they are able to manage and maintain their plot effectively. Failure to do so can result in the tenancy being terminated.

All plot holders must comply with the rules of the Society which are contained in the Allotment Handbook, available on our website: www.shas.org.uk/documents

How much does it cost?

Plot holders (and applicants for plots) must be members of SHAS. The annual membership charge for 2025 will be £10.00 for plot holders, £5.00 for non-plot holders.

All members receive:

- Access to our onsite 'Trading Hut' offering garden products at competitive prices
- Regular copies of our newsletter 'Grass Cuttings'
- Access to talks and events organised by the Society

In addition, plot holders have Associate Membership of the National Allotment Society, giving access to extra benefits, such as discounted seeds.

Rent for a plot is payable at the rate of £0.41/m² – this is the current rate, which is set by Trafford Borough Council. Plots range in size from under 50 to over 300 square metres, and the full rent for a typical plot of 120m² would be £49.20 per year, with a 50% reduction for over 60's.
